Calls for Spring 2024 KOLT Teaching Improvement Grants

KOLT grant program is now open for applications for the Spring semester of 2024. Five different calls with different emphases are open for this year. Please find the details of these calls below:

- 1. Call for KOLT Faculty Learning Communities (FLCs)

<u>Eligibility:</u> Koç University faculty members or instructors are eligible to apply for this grant program.

Funding: 25.000 TRY

Call 1: KOLT Call for Faculty Learning Communities (FLCs)

Faculty Learning Community (FLC) is a peer-led group of faculty members (varying number of 4-10 participants) who engage in an active, collaborative, year or semester long program, structured to provide encouragement, support, and reflection. FLC enables participants to investigate, question, explore, apply new or different classroom techniques, and provide solutions for just about any significant problem or opportunity in higher education through regular meetings. FLCs help improve teaching and learning across campus, both in the group members' individual classes and as the groups' insights spread to colleagues inside and outside the department.

The long-term goals of FLCs are to

- build university-wide community through teaching and learning and eventually create a learning organization
- increase faculty interest in undergraduate teaching and learning
- investigate and incorporate ways that enhance teaching and learning
- increase faculty collaboration across disciplines
- create an awareness of the complexity of teaching and learning

KOLT invites faculty members to become members of various KOLT Faculty Learning Communities (KOLT FLCs) or to form your own interest of FLCs. Topics can be centered around the areas of teaching and learning, digitally enhanced learning as provided below or another area of common interest. We encourage faculty at any rank to propose an FLC.

 Writing-Across-the-Campus FLCs: For this FLC faculty members from the departments of Academic Writing, ELC, humanities and social sciences are invited so there is enough commonality with academic writing styles, but enough disciplinary variety that all participants learn to better tailor their scholarship for increased reader accessibility and greater clarity of argument.



- Digitally Enhanced Learning FLCs: Within this theme, faculty members from various departments and disciplines are invited to form a FLC who wishes to include various digital tools and procedures to enrich learning environments and experiences.
- Active Learning FLCs: Within this theme, faculty members from various departments and disciplines are invited to use a main theme from the various active learning approaches such as inquiry-based learning, project-based learning, problem-based learning and teambased learning and to conduct the activities of FLCs.
- Virtual Exchange FLCs: Within this theme, faculty members from various departments and
 disciplines are invited to form a FLC based on the virtual exchange concept and work on the
 ideas for fostering the collaboration with UNIC partner institutions and other institutions who will
 be involved in virtual exchange activities.
- Other FLCs: There is no restriction on this theme. Faculty from various departments and disciplines can form their own FLC on topic of their interest with a focus on such as Artificial Intelligence (AI), Virtual Reality (VR) and/or Augmented Reality (AR).

Products and Dissemination: At the end of the FLC, members should plan to share the work of the FLC with the larger community in the campus. Options for presenting include, but are not limited to:

- A manuscript that is submitted to a peer-reviewed journal
- A proposal for a presentation or poster that is submitted to a major teaching and learning conference
- · A grant proposal that is submitted to a funding agency
- New or revised curricula or syllabus
- A seminar or panel proposal
- Digital resources
- Blackboard module(s)
- Blogs (multiple posts to an existing blog or a new blog for a professional audience)
- Podcast

Applications should include the following information in their application form:

- FLC Title
- Purpose
- Description
- Information about the members and their courses
- Timetable
- Expected Product(s) and Dissemination Plan

Funding: Each FLC will be granted up to **25.000 TRY** depending on the proposed budget plan. Eligible expenses for the grant are listed as follows:

- Structuring regular FLC meetings
- Purchasing educational materials, digital tools or service subscription fees that can be used by FLC participants
- Inviting a guest speaker specialized in teaching in related disciplines (honorarium, etc.)
- Conference, seminar or panel participation fee in a *national* conference
- Organizing activities such as panel discussion, seminar-webinar, summer school, retreats

NOTE: Purchases must be made according to the new purchasing regulations, and expense receipts should be submitted no later than *March 15, 2024* (for Spring 2024 FLCs). Please consult with KOLT about eligible purchases for this grant program.

NOTE: The FLCs are expected to start in February 2024 and work through the entire semester.

Call 2: Virtual Exchange Projects

You can apply to our grant program to develop a joint course or a project that will enable KU students to collaborate with students from different universities abroad, especially UNIC partners. You can search the database (https://drive.google.com/drive/folders/1qRrpsrKF0oodW5lFyFpYarl-oFlKTabJ) provided by the Office of International Programs (OIP) to find a partner. You can co-create a course or a short-term project depending on your mutual interest with your partner. KOLT will support you in:

- designing your virtual exchange course or project in line with the curricular requirements and inclusive teaching pedagogy and practices
- designing activities/tasks that build collaboration and cross-cultural skills (ice-breaking
 activities, collaborative tasks that require higher-order thinking skills about disciplinary or
 global issues, and practice of cultural knowledge and sensitivity, etc.)
- evaluating student performance in virtual exchange courses and projects via different assessment methods and tools (developing sound and secure online assessment methods, creating a rubric, etc.)
- managing pedagogical issues that may arise in virtual exchange courses and projects (how to address logistical problems such different class sizes, how to deal with a problem that could happen when discussing culturally sensitive issues, etc.)
- improving students' teamwork skills (This training will be open to students participating in virtual exchange courses and projects. The aim is to help students practice working in culturally and academically diverse teams before engaging with collaborative activities and tasks in virtual exchange courses and projects.).

- Purchasing educational materials, digital tools or service subscription fees
- Stipend for tutors or assistant students
- Other relevant expenses

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Call 3: Teach, Research, and Publish

You can receive a grant to research the effects of your innovative, active, interdisciplinary or digitally-enhanced learning and teaching practices that you have successfully used on your students' learning and document your results in the form of a publishable article, conference presentation, etc. The grant recipients can receive guidance and support from KOLT for research design and publication.

Products: You can produce one of the following products:

- A conference paper,
- A journal article,
- A book chapter

Applications should include the following information in their application form:

- Title of the course and project
- Purpose
- Description
- Timetable
- Products and expected results

Funding: Each project will be granted up to **25.000 TRY** depending on the proposed budget plan. Eligible expenses for the grant are listed as follows:

- Stipend for assistant students
- Conference participation
- Any other relevant expenses related to research and publication

Call 4: Gender Inclusive Teaching

You can receive a grant for developing gender-responsive pedagogical practices in your teaching. Grant recipients are expected to integrate gender-equal educational design principles into their teaching materials and practices in a meaningful and transformative way. Addressing implicit bias and gendered discriminations in the hidden curriculum; transforming the syllabus for a more intersectional and inclusive content; creating a safe and inclusive classroom culture; developing awareness, skills, and knowledge of the learners about gender equality and women's empowerment; designing genderfair and inclusive assessment methods are among the eligible teaching improvements for this grant. You can also develop projects that offer ways to link this call with the priorities of other three calls of this grant program. The applicants can receive guidance and support from KOLT and Gender Equality Office for their proposed improvements.

Funding: Each project will be granted up to **25.000 TRY** depending on the proposed budget plan. Eligible expenses for the grant are listed as follows:

- Purchasing educational materials, digital tools or service subscription fees for AI tools and technologies
- Stipend for assistant students
- Any other relevant expenses
